IS AMERICANISM DEAD? BY CHIEF FREDRICK NARMAN



What has happened to Americanism? Is it gone forever from today's modern and hectic world? One might think so by virtue of recent newspaper headlines, such as: College students picket White House on U.S. action in Viet Nam; American Nazi Party marches in protest; Klu Klux Klan under investigation; teen-age motorcycle club on rampage and terrorizes small town; conscientious objector wants discharge from Army; etc., etc. Sound commonplace? How could this happen in America - in a land to which each and every one of us should owe eternal gratitude for those before us? They have toiled, sacrificed and given their very lives, in the protection of our freedoms which these individuals manipulate, abuse and misapply.

Is Americanism and patriotism becoming old-hat? In retrospect, for those who can remember as I do, with a great amount of nostalgia - the Freedom Rallies of the old days; the good old Fourth of July with red, white and blue crepe paper on the kid's bicycles and carriages; how wonderful it was to march in a parade as a kid and have mom and dad point you out with pride as you marched by; the lump you got in your throat each time "The Stars and Stripes Forever" was played; the war veterans marching straight and proud in their old and faded uniforms that now were just a little too tight; the way you wanted to get up and march after seeing the movie, "Yankee Doodle Dandy", etc. Don't be dismayed, the loyal American is still here!
